<p><b>1 Station Tap</b> (formally the Molly Millar)</p> <p>RECOMMENDED</p>	<p>Station Road, Wokingham. RG40 2AD</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 977 4548</p>	<p>Fully refurbished in April 2018, this large pub is located next to Wokingham railway station. Featuring brand new TV screens with enhanced sound that show Sports TV, but with a quiet area suitable for families and people wanting to eat at the other end of the pub. CAMRA Members receive a 10% discount on real ale on presentation of their CAMRA membership card. The pub now also serves a range of changing craft beers, cocktails and has an extensive range of gins. For non-drinkers there are smoothies and iced frappe available. The current Guest Real Ale is from Windsor &amp; Eaton. Cask Marque pub.</p> <p>Open from 7am – Midnight (Mon-Wed); 7am – 1am (Thur); 7am – 2:30am – (Fri &amp; Sat); 11am – 11am to Midnight (Sun) Food is served from 11am - 9pm</p> <p>This pub serves 3 regular beers, – varies, Hogs Back TEA, Sharp's Doom Bar, Windsor &amp; Eaton Father Thames</p>
<p><b>2 Hope &amp; Anchor</b></p> <p>RECOMMENDED</p>	<p>Station Road, Wokingham. RG40 2AD</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 978 0918</p>	<p>This historic pub at the top of Station Road was constructed in the 17th Century from former ships' timbers and in 2012 was revitalised as a busy town-centre venue. The pretty garden has a heated smoking area and BBQ's are occasionally held in the summer months but otherwise food is no longer served on a regular basis. Live music most Saturday nights, sometimes Friday too. Cask Marque pub.</p> <p>Open from 12 Noon – 11pm (Mon-Thu); 12 Noon – Midnight (Fri); 12 Noon – 1am (Sat); 12 Noon – 11pm (Sun)</p> <p>This pub serves 2 regular beers, Brakspear Bitter, Wychwood Hobgoblin, and 1 changing locale beer (Hogs Back or Bond Brews). Also served Banks Lancaster Bomber and Marston's Saddle Tank.</p>
<p><b>3 Queen's Head</b></p> <p>RECOMMENDED</p>	<p>23 The Terrace, Wokingham. RG40 1BP</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 978 1221</p>	<p>Carol took over this cruck-framed inn in 2013 and has transformed it. Mainly of Tudor origin, it is situated on a charming terrace 400 yards up from the railway station in one of the oldest parts of the town. Greene King Abbot Ale, Hardys and Hansons Bitter (badged as Queen's Head Bitter) and three guest beers are always available. The guest beers are predominantly LocAle. Beer paddles with three third-pints make it easier to sample several different ales.</p> <p>The real fire creates a cosy feel in winter. There is a large, well-designed rear garden with a covered area, plus additional seating on the south-facing front terrace. The pub serves crisps/nuts and</p>

Cask Marque pub.</p> <p>Open from 12 Noon – 11pm (Mon-Thu); 12 Noon – 12.30am (Fri &amp; Sat); 12 Noon – 10.30pm (Sun)</p> <p>This pub serves 2 regular beers, Greene King Abbot, Hardys &amp; Hansons Queen's Head Bitter (House Beer).</p> <p>This pub serves 3 changing beers, Bingham Twyford Ripple, Loddon Winter Rays, West Berks Auntie Ruth</p>
<p><b>4 Broad Street Tavern</b></p> <p>RECOMMENDED</p>	<p>29 Broad Street, Wokingham. RG40 1AU</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 977 3706</p>	<p>Neatly pointed walls and metal railings mark the entrance to this well-run town-centre pub. At the front are two wood-paneled rooms, both cosy and quiet during the day; the larger having a real fire in winter. The central corridor leads to the bar then on to a large seating area that was extended in 2017. At the rear the biggest beer garden in the whole of Wokingham, lovely on warm days and balmy evenings. Food is served all day (steak night on Monday). Newspapers are available. Old Rosie served here. Quiz night Tuesday 8:30pm. No entry after 11pm Thurs-Sat. note: Waitrose car park is the nearest but until late afternoon they now have car-park checks and at the barrier want to see proof of purchase.</p> <p>Open from 12 Noon – 11pm (Mon-Thu); 12 Noon – Midnight (Fri &amp; Sat); 12 Noon – 10.30pm (Sun)</p> <p>Food is served from 12 Noon – 2.30pm &amp; 6pm – 9.30pm (Mon-Thu); 12 Noon – 2.30pm &amp; 6pm – 10pm (Fri); 12 Noon to 4pm &amp; 6pm – 10pm (Sat); 12 Noon – 5pm (Sun)</p> <p>This pub serves the full range of Wadsworth beers.</p>
<p><b>5 Sedero Lounge</b></p> <p>OPTIONAL</p>	<p>Bailey's House, Central Walk, Wokingham RG40 1AZ</p>	<p>This pub does not serve real ale; however, it is included as has been nominated as a Community Pub. This is a Café Bar that serves Bath Ales Dark Side and Cruiser Atlantic Pale Ale.</p> <p>Open 9am – 11pm (Mon -Wed), 9am – Midnight (Thur – Sat), 9am – 11pm (Sun).</p>
<p><b>6 Ship Inn</b></p> <p>RECOMMENDED</p>	<p>104 Peach Street, Wokingham. RG40 1XH</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 978 0389</p>	<p>A friendly former coaching inn, refitted in August 2015, giving the inside a cleaner brighter look. The large TVs in both bars are a big draw for all sports fans. Outside are new benches and tables, some of which catch the sun well into the afternoon. Some of the outdoor tables are under cover and heated. During big sporting events a TV is installed outside. Wholesome food is served at lunchtimes and evenings (all day at the weekend), with a daily specials board. Prices are up a little since the refit. Sunday is quiz night. Free Wi-Fi is available. The largest part of the pub which can be hired for functions is the very old and attractive 'barn' accessible from the main bar. Now gives 15% discount to CAMRA members.</p> <p>Open from 11.00am – 11.30pm (Mon &amp; Tue); 11.30am – Midnight (Wed - Sat); 11.00am – 11.30pm (Sun)</p> <p>This pub serves 4 regular beers, Fuller's ESB, Fuller's London Pride, Fuller's Oliver's Island &amp; Gales</p>

<b>7 Victoria Arms</b> <b>OPTIONAL</b>	1 Easthampstead Road, Wokingham. RG40 2EH  Tel No. 0118 979 9437	Friendly town centre pub. This pub/bar has benefitted enormously from a refurbishment and has seen its clientele change for the better. It still feels a little cramped, but there is definitely more space since the pool table went. Comfortable seats, friendly staff and a vaguely wine bar-ish feel makes this a pleasant venue for an early evening drink.  Open from 12 Noon – 11pm (Mon - Sat); 12 Noon – 10.30pm (Sun)  This pub serves 2 regular beers, Sharp's Doombar and Timothy Talyor Landlord.
<b>8 Red Lion</b> <b>OPTIONAL</b>	25 Market Place, Wokingham. RG40 1AP  Tel No. 0118 979 5790	A town-centre pub that buzzes at weekends with two bars downstairs, thriving as a Pad-Thai restaurant that serves drinks across the range. Beers are from the Brakspear list, best bitter plus a seasonal offering.  Open from 11am – 3pm, 5pm – 11pm (Mon-Thu); 11am – 11pm (Fri); 11am to Midnight (Sat); 11am - 11pm (Sun), but note was shut at 2:45pm on day of visit.  Food is served from 11am to 2pm and 6pm to 11pm (Mon-Fri)  This pub serves 2 regular beers, Brakspear Bitter, Brakspear - seasonal.
<b>9 Roebuck</b> <b>RECOMMENDED</b>	Market Place, Wokingham. RG40 1AL  Tel No. RG40 1AL	A tenth century coaching inn at the heart of Wokingham that retains much of its character - oak beamed ceiling and the old courtyard garden yet with all you would expect from a cosy town-centre pub. It has four big TV screens showing both Sky and BT Sports with a state-of-the-art audio system. There are regular Band Nights, with bands playing every other Saturday. The Pub has reopened after refurbishment with a new manager, Helena.  No food is available.  Open 11-11 Mon-Thu; 11-Midnight Fri & Sat; 12-11 Sun  This pub serves 2 regular beers; Sharp's Doom Bar and Timothy Taylor Landlord and serves 2 changing beers.
<b>10 Gig House</b> <b>OPTIONAL</b>	The Plaza, off Denmark Street, Wokingham. RG40 2LD  Tel No. 0118 912 3130	Recently re-opened under new management, a modern-built town centre pub standing on part of the site of the old Wellington Brewery. Here there were stalls for horses and a 'Gig' House for the carts they pulled around town, from which the pub derives its name. In summer, tables and chairs are set up on the Plaza for drinking and dining alfresco. Breakfast served until 12 noon. The Gig House Roast served all day Sunday.  Open from 8am – Midnight (Mon-Thur); 8am – 1.30am (Fri & Sat); 8am – Midnight (Sun) Food is served from 11am – 9pm (Mon – Sun)  The pub serves three hand-pumped beers (Sharp's Doom Bar & Atlantic, Bond Brews real ale)
<b>11 Raglan Pub &amp;</b>	Denmark Street,	A town-centre pub, modern in style, catering to both lunchtime workers and the late-night weekend

RG40 2AY</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 978 0309</p>	<p>Reputedly one of the oldest Inns in Wokingham, this locals pub is situated in the heart of the town and is free of tie. A friendly little hostelry, it offers up to five constantly changing real ales (normally three on weekdays and five at weekends) including local brews from the likes of Hogs Back and Loddon. The pub does not serve food other than on Sundays when hot bar snacks (sausages, roast potatoes and yorkshire puddings) are provided. However at other times you may bring in your own food. Charity events are hosted and beer festivals are held in the garden area, which has seating and a smoking area. A darts team is based here and Perudo, Poker and Aunt Sally (in Summer) are played here. Dogs are welcome despite the presence of a pub cat who frequently appears in the bar. Free Wi-Fi is available with the code displayed in the bar.</p> <p>Open from 12 Noon – 11pm (Mon-Thur); 12 Noon – Midnight (Fri &amp; Sat); 12 Noon – 10.30pm (Sun)</p> <p>This pub serves 4 changing beers.</p>

RG40 2BQ</p> <p>Tel No. 0118 978 0316</p>	<p>The Dukes Head has five en-suite rooms that are spacious and competitively priced. They are fully equipped and suitable for business or leisure travellers. The restaurant serves good traditional pub food and is famous for its hog roast and barbecues over the spring and summer. It offers a wide selection of lunch items for both eat in and take away.</p> <p>It has a car park and terraced garden and is happy to welcome families.</p> <p>Open from 11 – 12pm (Mon-Fri); 11 am – 1am (Sat &amp; Sun) Food is served from 12 Noon – 2pm (Mon-Sat); 12 Noon – 3pm (Sun)</p> <p>This pub serves 2 regular beers, Brakspear Bitter; Wychwood Hobgoblin and has 1 changing beers, currently Courage Best.</p>
